## Scott Hazelton

He has been part the broadcast team coverage of the Triple Crown, Dubai World Cup (G1) and Royal Ascot. His father Richard Hazelton won more than 4,700 races during a training career that spanned over 60 years.

Happy Breeders' Cup Future Stars Friday at Keeneland!

1st Race	8-6-2  #8 Open Road just beat a strong group of runners last time out, including a horse by the name of Tiz Rye Time who won an allowance race here during the fall meet at Keeneland. Should be able to control what is going on early on and be awfully tough late in the race as well.
2nd Race	6-7-5  #6 Klassy Bridgette ran second to a very good horse, and her only start of her career. Any move forward for this young horse will put her into the winner Circle in my opinion.
3rd Race	11-3-6  #11 Marsalis looks like he was going to be the next big thing out of the Steve Asmussen barn, following his winter campaign down in New Orleans. He was beaten in his most recent start, but he lost to a very good horse who we saw when here during the fall meet at Keeneland, name Run Classic. Run Classic earned a 105 Beyer Speed figure for his win here on 10/16.
4th Race	12-11-9  #12 Protege looks like the real deal of his only race, which he won by all length and 3/4 beating a horse named Lugan Knight who won here on 10/21 and flatter Protege in doing so.
5th Race	1-4-9  #1 Rattle N Roll comes into this race off of wins the Oklahoma Derby and St. Louis Derby in as a stout closer ever so we have seen when he's at his best. Should be tough at the mile and five eights distance watch for him to just keep on coming. He's also a past grade one winner here at Keeneland.
6th Race	10-3-2  #10 Tyler's Tribe is an absolute speedster, who has won all five of his races doing so with these in Iowa. This is obviously a big step up, but you've got to respect these connections for taking this swing on the big stage. He's never raced on grass but they've worked him a few times to get him ready for this, if he wins this, it'll be by breaking early on the lead and going on with it.
7th Race	7-8-5  #7 Chop Chop ran a massive race in the grade 1 Darley Alcibiades, to finish second beaten, just a nose behind Wonder Wheel, who'll be one of the favorites in this race. Her last race was her first time on dirt, and she proved that she is more than capable. Hopefully she can break a little better than she did in the grade one Darley Alcibiades and that will go a long way for her in winning today.
8th Race	9-13-11  #9 Delight was phenomenal in her win in the JP Morgan, Chase Jessiman stakes. She established the lead relaxed and put together a big finish. If she can do that today watch out.
9th Race	3-4-8  #3 Cave Rock Will be the shortest priced favorite in the first of two days of the Breeders' Cup and rightfully so. His races have been huge and nobody can keep up with him late and his workouts in Southern California have been equally as impressive drawing away from his competition. Cave Rock looks like the real deal.
10th Race	6-2-4  #6 Andthefwinneris what is one of the flashiest two year old Josie run today. He trained great. Going into the Castle and Key Bourbon Stakes and he ran to that training, winning that day. His training immediately following that victory looked very similar. Which is a huge positive for a young horse like this guy a lot, and should get a good price with all the attention going towards the international invaders.
